ARTICLE 16.To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate, transfer from available funds, borrow or otherwise provide the sum of \$20,000, or any other amount, to continue Montague's participation in DPU docket 16-103 (or any succeeding docket number), concerning a review of Berkshire Gas Company's five-year Forecast and Supply Plan, for the purpose of achieving a local, incremental, and timely solution to the Company's moratorium on new and expanded natural-gas service in Montague and other Pioneer Valley ratepayer Towns, and to participate in any appeals, consolidations of cases, or related regulatory or legal proceedings at the state or Federal level that will have any bearing on the end of the moratorium, or to pass any vote or votes in relation thereto. Funds appropriated in this Article shall be spent at the discretion of the Board of Selectmen. Funds appropriated in this Article may fund or help to fund actions undertaken by the Town alone or in conjunction with actions taken by any other municipality, coalition, or organization engaging in such regulatory or legal action.
