- 4. To-date in FY21, has your department experienced any notable successes, such as improving or providing new programs or services, or implementing new technologies? If so, please describe.
 - Modified all programming to accommodate COVID guidelines Traditional offerings have been modified to
 accommodate health concerns and new guidelines. Summer Camp was reduced to a morning program, youth
 soccer structure was modified, the Sawmill River 10K will be virtual, and youth basketball and aquatics will be
 adapted to fit within the new framework. We continue to explore new opportunities to broaden our service
 areas.
 - **Department website** The department recently launched its own dedicated website through Montague WebWorks. We feel this will serve the community well for the foreseeable future.
 - Facility improvements Barriers due to the pandemic greatly minimized programming and our need for staffing, allowing us to utilize some funding from our *P/T Wages Temp* line-item for facility improvements. At this point, we have replenished safety surfacing at Highland Park ahead of schedule, purchased grass seed for Unity Park, acquired a power-washer, purchased a new refrigerator for the Fieldhouse, and painted the Fieldhouse floor. We anticipate using additional funding for other facility improvements including a new highefficiency wood stove for the Unity Park Fieldhouse, re-surfacing the infield of ballfield #1 at Unity Park, and purchasing a new park sign for Rutter's Park. The re-allocation of funding has also allowed us to replace both backboards at the Unity Park Basketball Court that were damaged due to vandalism, as well as the deck on the tube slide at the Unity Park playground.
