# Authorize Grant Agreement for National Park Service Grant: Battle of Turners Falls in the amount of \$60,000

Ramsey: The National Park Service awarded the Town a \$60,000 grant through the American Battlefield Protection program to conduct a pre-inventory project to identify the likely locations of the Great Falls Battlefield and its associated sites which were part of the King Philip's war in 1676. The project includes a phased plan to protect the site, provide well-sourced information for a proposed cultural park. The site was a tribal gathering place but was turned into a multi-tribe war refugee camp that colonialists Capt Turner and Lt. Holyoke attached. This is the groundwork for federal recognition of the events that occurred here and part of the cultural economic development strategy of the area. The grant is one of 21 awarded across the country. Dave Brule is the coordinator who organizes and facilitates the meetings between the participating towns and tribes. My role is administrative: contract management, quarterly reports, procurement, etc. I will attend a mandatory training seminar in DC on August 26<sup>th</sup>. Expenses for this trip are covered by the grant. People interested in learning more can contact me or David Brule. Walters role is administrative only, approximately 80 hours total

The Town would be responsible for any amount over 110%, this is a standard agreement for a DOT projects. No non participating work is planned on this contract, meaning the Town is not committed to do any work on this project. The Town is responsible for maintenance of the road once the road is complete.

# Submit application for endorsement that Planning Board approval under Subdivision Control Law is not required for the conveyance of 2.2 acres to Mountain Research, LLC. The land will be subdivided from Map 17, Lot 13A in the Airport Industrial Park.

Ramsey: Mountain Research is exercising its right of first refusal on 2.2 acres in the Airport Industrial Park. Since the property is being sold by the Town the Town needs to submit this ANR subdivision plan to the Planning Board in order for the closing to proceed. Plan has been prepared at the Buyers expense, Mountain Research, aka Yankee Environmental will now own 9.225 acres, their expansion plans are undefined at the moment.

Authorize submission of a MASSWORKS grant application to construct the Turnpike Road Industrial Park Ramsey: The grant would fund the development of the Turnpike Road Industrial Park. The neighborhood-scale light industrial park would create 6 developable lots ranging from 3.8 to 14.7 acres (a total of 38 developable acres). The MassWorks grant would construct a <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> mile subdivision roadway extending from the terminus of Sandy Lane. The work would include providing water, sewer, communications conduit, and underground electricity. Judd Wire, Inc. an established business and the largest employer in Montague, would be the anchor of the park. The park would provide a critical 4.6 acres to allow for future expansion and parking lot relocation for Judd Wire, Inc. After construction of the roadway, the Town of Montague, in partnership with the Montague EDIC would be responsible for developing the six lots to maximize job creation in the region and expand the municipal tax base. The remaining 100+ acres municipally owned land would remain undeveloped open space to ensure that natural resources and surrounding environs are not adversely affected. The capped burn dump is planned for solar development, which is allowed by-right. The solar development may be used to support future industry. The goals of the Turnpike Road Industrial park are as follows: - Increase the supply of developable industrial land and employment opportunities in Franklin County and Montague; -Retain expanding businesses in Franklin County and expand key market clusters (food processing and precision manufacturing); -Develop low-impact industry in a manner consistent with nearby neighborhoods; - Ensure productive re-use of an infill development site in a regional employment center. Total grant request: \$1,486,000
