#### **Jeff Singleton**

#### Memo regarding FRTA Response and Proposal

Singleton: The FRTA has responded to the Selectboard letter about potential route changes for Montague and other transit issues.. They have proposed to meet with town officials about the issues we have raised. I would suggest that the board support such a meeting ASAP. Proposed Route Changes For Montague: I suggest we put the attached route reorganization proposal on the table as the basis for discussion and input over the next six months. I am not asking that the board endorse the proposal but simply support it as a basis for the discussion. The goal would be to have something to present to the FRTA advisory board at its May annual meeting that could be implemented in the next fiscal year. The Montague Energy Committee has endorsed this approach. My proposal essentially consolidates the current Routes 22 (within Montague) and Route 32 (Greenfield-Montague-Orange). It fills in some of the gaps the consolidation creates with an expanded Route 23 (Amherst). The fare to Amherst is reduced to \$1.50 from the current \$3.00. The result is increased access to Amherst and less redundancy in the system without raising Montague's assessment. However there are many issues that will need to be evaluated further with the help of the FRTA and public input.

Fairbrother makes the motion to support Jeff Singletons proposal as presented and encourage other representatives bring to FRTA and discuss as needed

Increasing Ridership: The board and the Energy Committee have requested that the FRTA establish a committee or some mechanism to discuss increasing ridership. I raised the issue at the last FRTA advisory board meeting and there was some support from COG. The recent FRTA letter does not address this issue directly so we need to raise it again.

### **Montague Energy Committee**

# Authorize request for Owner's agent Technical Assistance grant from DOER to assess options for energy efficiency and renewable at the Hillcrest and Sheffield Schools

Ramsey: The Montague Energy Committee has met twice with the school superintendent, Michael Sullivan, and Joanne Blier, school director of business and operations, about opportunities for improving the energy efficiency of the Hillcrest and Sheffield Schools and adding renewable energy. To that end, we requested and received approval from the BoS and the school committee to add these school buildings into the town's Green Communities energy reduction plan. With that now in place, Montague can apply for funds for technical assistance to have an energy engineer evaluate energy-saving opportunities, and, in the future, apply for Green Communities grants for these measures.

Currently, the school district has an application in process for a grant from the Massachusetts School Building Authority for a new or rebuilt steam boiler for Sheffield School and for new windows. The Energy Committee has gotten support from the superintendent for the possibility of expanding the scope of the energy efficiency efforts beyond repairing or replacing the steam boiler, especially since steam heat is much less efficient than hydronic (hot water) heating and other options. The superintendent agrees with the recommendation of the energy committee to ask MSBA if they would either slow their grant process to allow for the possibility of getting a comprehensive energy assessment with a grant from DOER for their Owner's Agent Technical Assistance grants, to bring in an energy engineer to assess the options for efficiency, or at least to work with the committee to look at replacing the steam boiler with a more efficient system with MSBA funds that takes into account possible future energy efficiency improvements.

Given that DOER is actively promoting OATA grants because these funds are not being sufficiently tapped, there's a good likelihood that we would receive this grant, and the application is not a complex one. The energy committee will help fill in the gaps in the application as needed.
