Review and consider Robert Obear's Commercial Homesteading Proposal for 15 Power Street" Procurement Summary:

Notice: RFP Released (posted at Town Hall and on Town website) July 26, 2016; Notice published in MA Central Register August 3, 2016; Notice in Greenfield Recorder and Daily Hampshire Gazette August 3, 2016. Interest: 14 Potential respondents obtained the RFP, 2 potential respondents attended the site walk. Proposals opened on October 13, 2016: One complete proposal was received from Robert Obear. Proposal Summary: Rehabilitate existing 10,000 square foot structure into 2 live/work units with remaining 4/5 of floor area dedicated to artists/business incubator space — what the developer calls the Power Street Art/Biz Collaborative. The proposed purchase price is \$10,000 (\$10,000 min). The committed minimum equity investment is \$75,000 (\$75,000 min) although the developer plans to invest between \$600K and \$732K. Proposal Review: Proposals were reviewed and scored by Town Planner, Town Administrator and Building Inspector in accordance with the 7 comparative criteria in the RFP (experience, qualifications, responsiveness to RFP, level of investment, economic impact, feasibility and site improvements). Based on the cumulative and average scoring, the proposal was deemed to be "advantageous" to the town. The individual score sheets are available on file. Staff interviewed Mr. Obear on October 26, 2016 Recommendation: The staff review team recommends accepting Robert Obear's response this commercial homesteading solicitation.

Development Goals of the project are: the developer of the "Power St., Art /Biz Collaborative" intends to create a maximum of 2 new live/work spaces in conjunction with an additional 17 artists/business incubator spaces. We plan to create a rooftop solar array to power the buildings' common areas and HVAC systems. We plan to reconnect water, sewer and gas utilities to the building. We plan to restore the exterior finishes and façade of the building to historical standards through the state historical tax credit program, as well as the federal tax credit program. The developer reserves the right to alter or modify his planned use if the market demand changes. We reserve the right to apply for any allowable uses under current zoning regulations in addition to or in place of the initial intended and described use. The developer's primary goals include but are not limited to: 1) providing economic benefit and employment opportunities for the town of Montague 2) to increasing the supply of artist and commercial workspace in the town of Montague 3) to catalyze further redevelopment and private investment in the historic Mill District 4) to generate tax revenue for the town of Montague through redevelopment of the property 5) to help foster further the redevelopment of this blighted area through granting of a TIFF. Hope to break ground in Spring, largest obstacle is getting water and sewer to the property as there currently no connections.

Questions listed on handout from Mrs. Golrick was asked and given to Walter for further review.

Bob McDonald, WPCF Superintendent, and Grant Weaver, Interim Superintendent, FY17 Sewer Rate Hearing

Abbondanzio: Two votes made at last special town meeting, one was to rescind an article that would have taken \$200,000 out of sewer user fees and put them into the sewer capitalization fund, that was assuming we were going to get revenue from the process that is not happening yet so that was rescinded. Special Town Meeting approved using \$200,000 in retained earnings to set the sewer rate. This is a 17% increase

Weaver: Then we ran the numbers to see how it will work and this really drains the reserves down to a low number.

Abbondanzio: To use any more than the \$200,000 would be dangerous as we don't know what we are taking in from the sludge and we don't want to build to large of a number into retained earnings budget base because next year the sewer users will get hit with a huge increase. We are trying to find a balance.

McDonald: Is waiting for John to return and he will be hiring two more people.

Brief discussion about DEP order and the new process

Weaver: In developing the rates, 17% increase was applied throughout. Historically there has been a surcharge, an extra charge for stronger Wastewaters. The idea being that extra loading on the treatment plant carries extra operating expenses. During this "intermission" where we are not receiving any trucked in waste has been processing so much suspended solids it doesn't make a lot of sense to continue these surcharges so I am recommending they be zero'd out. There no longer is much justification for it.

Abbondanzio points out that there should be a caveat that if the "process" stops this can be added back in.

Discussion about capital projects and funding and further talks about the process and how it effects the budget

Mr. Blanker suggests the Town speak with the Water Dept. regarding proper water flow/billing to see if there is a disconnect.

As a result with the contractor going ahead in phase 1 and installing the pipe without notifying the engineer the discrepancy in the engineering plans and what they were seeing in the ground, the contractor took actions that were detrimental to the Town. What they did was lay the pipe in at an elevation that caused us to do a second phase sewer project on Industrial Boulevard. As a result of that, the Town is seeking reimbursement in the amount of \$459,500 for the work that was incurred in Phase II on Industrial Blvd unnecessarily due to the contractor's inaction.
