FY2018 Community Development Block Grant Program (CDBG)

Public Informational Meeting

Kuklewicz reads the notice the record.

McHugh gave some background on the CDBG Program:

- Funded through the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development, an allocation that the States gets on a yearly basis.
- The State holds a competitive application process.
- Projects must meet the national objective of either benefitting low-to-moderate income people, eliminating slum and blight, or responding to catastrophic projects.
- This year, the State's allocation is \$19 million.
- There are five categories: Housing Assistance, Public Facilities, Infrastructure, Public Social Services, and Planning Projects.
- There will be a public hearing at the end January that will be a presentation of the activities that were chosen to move forward.
- The application is due on March 2nd and the Town is eligible for \$800,000.

Presentations of potential activities were made:

Meals on Wheels Program (Jane Severance, Nutrition Program Director at Lifepath)

- Home-delivered meal program
- Serves 30 towns, about 540 meals a day
- The program has been delivering meals in Montague for 43 years, and demand continues to grow as population ages
- In the last survey, 71% said that noontime is the main meal of the day and 28% said there would be a shortage of food in the house without the delivered meals.
- A wellness check is part of the program.
- Of the staff, 24 are paid, 100 are site volunteers total program-wide, 56 are volunteer drivers
- Donation of \$3/meal is requested

Montague Youth Leadership Program (Dana Mengwasser, Executive Director at The Brickhouse)

- Facilitated by Brick House staff as well as experts in the arts, social justice, communication, and wellness programming
- Gives youth the opportunity to step into leadership roles and give input on the programs
- Hoping to serve 30 individuals between the ages of 11 and 18, 84% or more of which are from low-to-moderate income homes
- YOLO Program:
 - Offers youth opportunity to develop leadership skills through providing empowerment-based antibullying trainings
 - Wide range of topics including social justice education, job readiness training, healthy relationships, skills development, substance abuse prevention, domestic violent prevention
- Momentum Arts Group:
 - Helps develop creative skills
 - o Helps develop entrepreneurship skills

Western Massachusetts Recovery Learning Community (Natan Cohen from Western Massachusetts Training Consortium)

- Community of mutual support and advocacy made up of people who have experienced trauma, psychiatric diagnoses, addictions, homelessness, violence, and a variety of life struggles
- Help each other access resources and advocate for each others' needs
- Offer alternative wellness activities for people who cannot afford them
- Hope to develop some satellite support and activities in places where people cannot reach one of the main centers
- Alternative to Suicide support group is a very popular offering

Families Learning Together (Heather Wood and Jimena de Pareja from Montague Catholic Social Ministries)

- Born from a program originally geared towards Spanish-speaking adults; focus shifted to the children of those families
- Parents/Caregivers are required to come to the after-school homework help program to support children and continue to improve their own English skills
- Aim to serve 50 Montague residents
- Tight relationship between school teachers/administrators and the program coordinator (Jimena)
- Self-assessments at end of each trimester

Rutter's Park Improvement Project (Anja Duffy, Landscape Architect from GZA)

- Notable community involvement during five or six community meetings to give input into the design
- Will be getting topographic survey in the next day or two
- Duffy walked through a presentation of the Final Master Plan, pointing out the town green, tree plantings, electric wires, shade trees and ornamental trees, a pavilion, the playground, vehicular gate, picnic tables, grill pits, a flag pole with a patio, accessible parking with bike racks, an evergreen screen with a chain link fence, a timber guard rail, raised garden beds, an informational kiosk, a rain barrel, paved walkways, a paved play area, and a mini orchard.

Avenue A Streetscape Improvements Phase III Project (Carlos Nieto, LA from Berkshire Design Group)

- Nieto walked through a presentation of the current design of Spinner Park, pointing out the new sculpture location, a system of granite walls that provides seating, integrated seating with backs, concrete walkways with brick striping, new planter locations, new lighting, and a new electrical box.
- Nieto walked through a presentation of the streetscape improvements, pointing out new pedestrian lighting, concrete walkways with brick striping, new planters (some with seating), a bench, a featured area in front of Shea Theater, concrete in the alleyway, bump-outs, two crosswalk signs, and new light posts.
