## **Summary Proceedings:**

1. Minutes of January 27, 2022 voted unanimously

## 2. Farren discussion:

- a. CSL: the Farren is now listed on the State Register of Historic Places. National registration cannot go forward now; interior maps, floor plan, photos are needed.
- b. We have no word from Trinity re. their assessment; unknown if Trinity will allow an independent assessment.
- c. A motion was made by CSL to send the MHC letter of request and inquiry to Trinity. DB seconds the motion. Discussion:
  - 1) Concerns, reservations expressed by CC re our authority to communicate with Trinity directly.
  - 2) SLM confirms that the Board of Selectmen and Town Administrator acknowledge the MHC can communicate independently and directly with Trinity.
  - 3) CSL indicates there has been some interest expressed in the building by the organization Missionaries of the Poor and an unnamed private developer.
  - 4) A demolition delay by-law has been crafted by CSL and Planner Walter Ramsey; being reviewed by town counsel.
- d. Vote taken: DB, CSL, SLM in favor, CC and EG vote against. (NB: EG, joining late, voted no.)
- e. Motion carried, letter will be sent.

## 3. Other topics:

- a. Master Plan for the Canal District in progress.
- b. Committee for Comprehensive Development Plan with representatives from all boards will convene in mid-March
- c. Member of the public Jeff Singleton reminds MHC of need to follow due process concerning historic registration and future plans for historic structures/bridges especially the 6<sup>th</sup> Street bridge, Montague Center library, et al.

d. DB updates commission on progress of the NPS Battlefield study and Advisory Board continuing to meet the first Wednesday of every month.
