Approved minutes from 11.17.20: vote passed.

- Status Reports
 - Renewable energy heating system for Sheffield/Hillcrest school buildings, CIC Assessment (Ariel) Nothing to report.
 - Outdoor lighting upgrades to LED (Chris): Nothing to report. Pam raised the topic of a new HPS light half way up Unity St., example of light that's too bright and shines upwards. Chris will raise that issue next time he speaks with the Turners Falls Fire District and/or Montague Lighting District.
 - Status of adjustments to solar bylaws. (Sally) Tabled.
 - DPW Building (Jason): Has been chasing controls contractor around, who's about at the end of his work. Everything's adjustable that needs to be, heat pump will be squared away tomorrow. Some tweaking of temperatures and schedules for operation is possible. System is doing about all that it can be expected to do. Eversource's high demand rate structure poses a problem, makes using electricity for heat substantially more expensive than using oil at its current low price. Chris suggested once building energy use settles into a pattern, looking at possibility of solar array and battery storage.
- Letter to MA legislature's climate conference committee (possible vote to recommend to selectboard) Tabled.
- Tracking use of C-PACE (checking if cycle shop that was interested make any progress). Tabled.
- Ventilation under Covid, concerns about advisories to open windows in winter: Pam said pandemic recommendations for schools, etc. don't specify HEPA rating of filters. Europe is bringing in fresh air without using more energy. Questions of how to address filtration, ventilation, positioning of

Tuesday, December 15, 2020 buildings, not just for current pandemic but future ones. Chris said it's hard to upgrade exisiting buildings, but definitely an important issue long-range. Pam said it's important to find out what current systems and capabilities are in the schools. Chris: could the Energy Committee gather information and make a recommendation to the schools? Pam will invite architect with expertise in this area to talk with MEC.
