NOTICE OF HEARING NUISANCE OR DANGEROUS DOG

On **Monday, December 18, 2023 at 6:02 PM** the Montague Selectboard will hold a public hearing in the Montague Town Hall, One Avenue A, Turners Falls, MA, in accordance with Massachusetts General Laws, Chapter 140, Section 157, to determine whether the dogs owned and/or kept by you at 20 K Street, Turners Falls, Massachusetts, are Nuisance or Dangerous Dogs as defined in said statute.

This hearing is being convened in response to a complaint from the Town's Director of Public Health that an unlicensed dog kept by you at the property was roaming loose on November 16, 2023 and that it was involved in an attack on a smaller dog resulting in injuries to the dog and its owner. During the hearing, the Board will examine the evidence, which will include and examination of the complainant under oath, and based on the credible evidence and testimony presented, the Board may make such findings and orders concerning the restraint or disposal of said dog as may be deemed necessary, which may include an order that the dog be humanely euthanized.

You may attend the hearing and at that time you may produce any documentation and/or witnesses. You may be represented by counsel at your own expense if you so choose.

NARRATIVE FOR SERGEANT JOHN DEMPSEY

Ref: 23-327-OF

On 11/16/2023 at approximately 1445 hrs I, Sgt Dempsey and Officer Pervere were dispatched to a dog bite incident which had occurred on K Street in Turners Falls. Upon arrival we were met by Denise Bouchard and Bonnie Sokoloski who were visibly shaken. Bouchard was holding a small dog that had multiple puncture wounds to his body. Bouchard had visible bleeding to one of her fingers which was checked by ambulance personnel. She refused to go to the hospital as she was concerned about getting her dog to the Animal Hospital. Bouchard stated she was walking her dog when another dog (later identified as a Pit bull named Tyson) approached her. Pit bull "Tyson" attempted to get at Bouchard's dog as she was holding him in her arms. "Tyson" bit Bouchard in the process of aggressing toward the dog she was holding. At some point Tyson bit Bouchard's dog several times causing severe trauma. Bouchard and Sokoloski stated that the dog came from 20 K street, which was a few feet from where the incident occurred.

I made contact with Austin Demers who was inside of 20 K Street. Demers stated he did not see the incident, but was aware his dog got outside of the fenced yard in the rear of the residence. Demers stated the dogs name was Tyson and described him as a Pit bull mix. Demers stated that the dog belonged to him and his girlfriend Brianna Snyder. Demers stated that they recently acquired Tyson and thought the dog was up to date on his shots.

Demers stated that Tyson was outside with when he got out of the yard. Demers stated he had contacted his girlfriend and the previous owner of Tyson was coming to house because of the incident. Demers stated that she would have more information concerning Tyson's registration and shot status.

I then spoke to who stated he was outside in the back yard with Tyson when Tyson bolted out of the fence gate which he was able to push open. It stated that he saw Tyson going after Bouchard and her dog. It stated that he grabbed Tyson by the collar and pulled him away, then brought him back to 20 K Street.

Holly Bartolon arrived a short time later and identified herself as the previous owner of Tyson. Bouchard stated that Tyson was registered in the City of Greenfield and that he was up to date on his rabies shots. She attempted to locate the record in her phone, but was unable to find the document. Bartolon stated that Tyson received his vaccinations through a visiting Vet at Tractor Supply in Greenfield. She stated she would locate the records and email them to me. At the time of this report I have not received an email and when I called Bartolon on the phone it went to voice mail.

At approximately 1950 hrs I received notification from the Montague Police Dispatch that Bouchard had to euthanize her dog and that she was going to the Baystate Franklin Medical Center for treatment of her wound. Dispatch.

On 11/17/23 at approximately 1045 hr Snyder brought a copy of Tyson's rabies vaccination record. The document does have Tyson's name on it, and the description of him matches on the record. The vaccination record shows an expiration date of 08/17/23. The vaccination was given at the Greenfield Tractor Supply (PetVet). I made to contact Holly Bartolon to ascertain if there is another record showing that Tyson's rabies vaccine as valid but was advised that there was not. Bartolon told me that she gave Tyson away because she was expecting a baby and knew she would be too busy to properly care for him. She stated that Tyson had never been a problem prior to

giving him away and was a good family dog. She was surprised to learn of this incident.

Denise Bouchard was advised of the expired vaccination and was told to speak to a doctor about her getting preventative shots as the rabies shot was only 3 months expired.





On Friday November 17, 2023 at approximately 12:49 PM I Franklin County Regional Animal Control Officer Deputy Judie Garceau(ACO Garceau) received a call from Gabi Trudeau Office Manager at the Franklin County Regional Dog shelter(Trudeau). Trudeau stated that a woman Denise Bouchard(Bouchard) just called in reporting that she and her dog were attacked yesterday by a neighbor's dog. Trudeau provided me with a phone number 413-863-0174 and asked me to give her a call.

At 12:54PM I placed a phone call to Bouchard and asked when was a good time to meet to discuss yesterday's incident. Bouchard stated that she was currently home and I responded to her residence of 63 Seventh Street Turners Falls MA 01376.

At 12:58 PM I arrived at the residence. Upon arriving Bouchard's partner Bonnie Sokoloski(Sokoloski) invited me into the home. When I entered the home I could see that Bouchard was visibly upset and crying. I navigated through the clutter into the living room, I could also smell an odor of alcohol coming from the room. When Bouchard began talking about the incident Bouchard repeatedly stated that he killed my baby. I feel so bad that I couldn't help him and I'm sorry I just can't get the images out of my head. Bouchard then continued by saying that she was walking her chihuahua named Charlie down the sidewalk on K street around 2:30PM yesterday. When she got in front of the residence located at 20 K Street a pit bull named Tyson came out from that back yard and attacked Charlie on the sidewalk in front of the driveway. Bouchard said that she then picked up Charlie to try and protect him. When Bouchard picked Charlie up Tyson jumped up and bit her in the hand. Bouchard said that the force of Tyson jumping up on her knocked her to the ground. Bouchard then went on to say that a boy (came out from the backyard and pulled Tyson off of them by the collar.

At approximately 1:02pm I asked Bouchard if she could show me the injuries she sustained from the incident. At 1:02pm I photographed said injuries(Please see exhibit 1A-G). Upon completion, Bouchard stated that she had Charlie upstairs and that they were going to bury him in their yard. At that time, I asked if I would be able to see Charlie. I was escorted up stairs to where Charlie was being held. At 1:05PM I began photographing Charlie.(Please see exhibit #2A-F) After photographs were taken I returned down stairs to finish my interview.

Narrative Entry Form

At approximately 1:12PM I asked Bouchard if she had taken Charlie to the Animal Hospital after the incident. Bouchard responded yes and provided me with a physical copy of the receipt that I photographed(Please see exhibit #3)Bouchard stated that if you could have seen the x-rays it was like swiss cheese. Bouchard's partner Bonnie Sokoloaki(Sokoloaki) then stated that when the vet came out and told them that they could do some things but it would be like \$10,000. Bouchard and partner then chose to euthanize Charlie.

At approximately 1:35PM I completed my interview. I then provided Bouchard with a formal complaint form and asked her to fill it out the best she could and provide me with a statement of the incident. At the time of this report I have not received a formal complaint form or written statement.

At 1:45PM I called the Montague animal inspector Kathleen Burek(Burek) and advised her that a quarantine would need to be placed on Tyson.

At approximately 1:52PM I arrived at 20 K Street to speak to Tyson's owner Brianna Snyder(Snyder) about the attack. I knocked on the door and waited. While waiting, I noticed that there was a camera pointed at the door. After a few minutes Snyder came out of the residence and on to the steps. Snyder stated she wasn't there at the time of the incident but from what she heard Tyson muscled through the backyard gate and went after Charlie. At that time Snyder's boyfriend Austin Demers(Demers)came out of the residence and stood on the steps as well. I then asked Synder if Tyson was licensed with the town of Montague to which Snyder told me that she just got Tyson from a co-worker so she had not licensed him. Snyder was unable to name the co-worker. I asked Snyder if Tyson was licensed in another town and Snyder stated yes either Greenfield or Gill. I then asked Snyder if Tyson was up to date with his rabies vaccination. Snyder responded that he was. I asked to see the paperwork. Snyder then walked over to her car and retrieved the paperwork. After reviewing the paperwork I informed Snyder that Tyson was not current with his rabies vaccine and that it had expired on 7/17/2023. Snyder had mistaken the expiration date of the Lot which was highlighted for Tyson's vaccine expiration date. At that time, Snyder stated that she had scheduled an appointment for Tyson to go to the vet at tractor supply through Petvet on 11/18/2023. I advised Snyder to please send a copy of that paperwork to me via email. On 11/18/2023 at 6:17PM I received the email from Snyder with Tyson's updated vaccination.(Please see exhibit #4)

On November 17, 2023 at approximately 2:00PM I then asked Snyder if she could take Tyson outside so I

could get a picture of him. Demers went into the home and took Tyson outside in the backyard. At 2:02PM I

began photographing. I started with the gate to the backyard where Snyder claimed Tyson broke through the

gate. (Please see exhibit #5) I then photographed Tysons face and neck. (Please see exhibits #6,7,8,) At the

time of photographing Tyson was wearing a shock collar. (Please see exhibit #9) When I asked about the

shock collar Snyder stated that it also has a beep and vibration mode and Tyson usually responds before

having to shock him.

At approximately 2:05PM I advised Snyder that the animal inspector would be on her way to issue Tyson a

quarantine and completed my interview.

At 2:13PM the animal inspector returned my call and stated that within the hour Tyson's quarantine would be

issued.

On November 21,2023 I conducted follow-up on the interview with Snyder. At approximately 11:05 AM I arrived

at the Greenfield Town Hall to see if Tyson was currently licensed under the previous owner. After speaking

with the town clerk Tyson was not licensed for the year of 2023.

As of November 22,2023 at approximately 9:15AM I have not yet received a formal complaint form or

statement from Bouchard. At this time, I am following up with the veterinarian to gather a full detailed report of

injuries sustained to Charlie.



I am requesting the board change the Part-Time Reserve Officer pay from its current range with a max of \$28.00 an hour to the Step in the Patrol Officer wage scale reflecting their years of full-time status. Retirees would be at the max step which is currently \$32.35 an hour.

I would also request the Reserve Officers receive the current shift differential for working the 3-11 or 11-7 night shifts. \$1.00 & \$1.25 respectively per hour.

SECTION TWO:

Wage/salary schedule and step increases, shall go into effect on July 1 or such other date as established by this Agreement. Newly hired and transferred/promoted employees must be working for the Town in their new grade/step for a period of 3 months prior to receiving a negotiated step increase for their new grade/position or else they are not entitled to any such increases until the effective date of step increases in the following fiscal year.

SECTION THREE:

A shift differential will be paid as follows:

3:00 p.m. - 11:00 p.m. \$1.00 per hour 11:00 p.m. - 7:00 a.m. \$1.25 per hour

SECTION FOUR:

When a patrol officer acts as "officer in charge" of an entire shift by assignment, he/she shall receive overtime compensation pay of One Dollar (\$1.00) per hour in addition to his/her regular pay, not an "Acting Sergeant" rate.

SECTION FIVE:

The Parties agree that K-9 officers spend no more than one-half (½) hour, on average, caring for the K-9 per day. In light of this, effective January 1, 2018, the K-9 officer shall receive a stipend of up to three and one-half (3½) hours' additional compensation per week at time and one-half the federal minimum wage (currently \$7.25 per hour) in compensation for the additional duties that are associated with the handling of the K-9. The K-9 officer shall be responsible for submitting this overtime each week. On weeks when the K-9 officer is on vacation and/or the K-9 is otherwise kenneled during the K-9 officer's absence, then the K-9 officer is not eligible for the one-half (½) hour of compensation on days he is not caring for the K-9 outside of regularly scheduled work hours. This payment is outside the base rate of pay for contractual overtime purposes.

SECTION SIX:

When unit members are promoted/assigned to a new position that results in a move to another pay scale in the labor agreement, the unit member will be placed on the Step on the new scale that allows for a ninety-five cent (95¢) per hour increase (or yearly equivalent if not an hourly position).

Montague Comcast Committee — Letter of Interest

I corresponded previously with Steven Ellis and some other members of the town government about possibly helping with the upcoming Comcast contract negotiations. Reaching out more formally (as requested) with an explicit letter stating my interest in assisting.

I've been a resident of the town since 2020, and I've been on Town Committee since 2021. In regards to my bona fides: I'm a former technology reporter with better-than-average technical knowledge, I write the technology column for the Reporter on a volunteer basis, and I currently work remotely for a smartphone startup in California as head of communications there. I've also been a deep advocate of community-based internet solutions, and I know a few people in Leverett who worked on that town's municipal fiber system.

I don't know of any direct conflicts of interest that might prevent me from participating — I have no employment or financial relationships with any ISPs or other companies that may directly compete with Comcast. However, I should note that the company I work for does occasionally do business with cellular carriers, including MVNOs, and Comcast is an MVNO provider. It is possible that my company may do business with them in their capacity as a phone retailer in the future, though I do not believe it would have any direct bearing on the cable business negotiations the town plans to do. I may be able to recuse myself internally should any such business happen until the town's negotiation is complete, though I can't necessarily guarantee that my employer will require otherwise.

I have pretty strong feelings in general when it comes to Comcast's business practices and the de facto monopoly they secure in most markets that they serve (sadly, including Montague). I am deeply motivated, on behalf of both myself and my neighbors, to try to bring competition into our market so they are required to act in the customer's interests rather than rest easy knowing our constituents have no other choice when it comes to high-speed internet. This is because internet connectivity is not a luxury anymore but a requirement for even basic employment in many cases and a fundamental part of participation in modern life.

Despite this, the US pays higher-than-average prices for high-speed internet connectivity, ranking in the top 5, according to some recent studies. And yet, our average internet speeds fall below those of many other countries on both upload and download speeds. Furthermore, as the recent pandemic proved, both work-from-home and remote education efforts suffer greatly from the artificially reduced upload speeds companies like Comcast force on customers. Massachusetts ranks only 23rd in the US for wireless internet speeds and 14th for wired speeds. And while the 23 Mbps wired upload speed noted as the state average (by Ookla for October 2023 at Speedtest.net) is more than the 3.8 Mbps upload recommended by services

<u>like Zoom</u> for a single HD call, that's a limit even a medium-sized household can hit very quickly if all members need to use it, far below Comcast's network capacity, and a joke compared to services like Google Fiber, AT&T's wired access, Verizon's wired access, and what our neighbors offer in Leverett.

On top of that, Comcast's service in recent weeks has been unreliable for many Montague customers, with network "upgrades" happening outside communicated and scheduled times and for longer durations than claimed, disrupting billing for local businesses and interfering with basic, expected, and paid-for connectivity.

In short: While I'm not sure it's in our power through this contract to try to make a difference in regards to the level and quality of service for Comcast subscribers in Montague, if there is an opportunity to make a positive difference, I'd really like to.

We present this as a framework for what we envision to be smooth and orderly transition over the next 6 months.

Given the existing proximity and access that WR has to SE and the long lead time, we propose that WR be appointed to TA effective upon the date of SE's last day in the office (Assumed 6/24/2023). We propose hiring a new Assistant Town Administrator on or about June 17, 2024 to allow for up to a two week overlap with the incumbent ATA WR. We feel a two week overlap would be sufficient to get the new ATA important hands-on training from both WR and SE. Any longer would be an inconvenience as there is no office space available and comes at an expense to the Town of approximately \$2,000/week. An added benefit of this timeline is that it may allow the ATA position and job description to be considered within the context of the pay and classification study which should be delivered by February.

ATA Hiring Committee

In order to find the best possible candidate for ATA, the Board will want to consider establishing a hiring committee. The Board has discretion as to how many individuals make up the committee and who is represented. Typically a hiring committee will have no more than seven members in total.

We recommend that the group should consist of the incumbent ATA, the Selectboard's Executive Secretary, two department heads, one representative from the Selectboard, One representative from the CIC, and one at-large member from the community. TA will assist as may be required.

ATA Hiring Timeline

Based on a recommended target hire date of June 17, 2024 and assuming an external hiring process, we propose the following hiring schedule:

FY24 Budget Impacts (Current Budget Year)

New ATA Overlap

We propose up to two weeks of Overlap costs upwards of \$2,000/ week. Two weeks is adequate given office space availability. This would cover the last two weeks of FY24. Proposed scenario one would cost \$4,000, compared to Scenario 2 which would cost \$8,000.

SE Sick leave and vacation buyback

A buyback of approximately \$22,600 will need to be accounted for in Special Article Request at Winter STM or at the FY24 ATM.

FY 25 Budget Impacts (Next Fiscal Year)

In FY25, the Selectboard Office budget accounts for the ability to hire SE on a limited on-call basis for technical consulting to the new TA.

The FY25 budget assumes the same pay and grade for the TA and ATA, however that figure is subject to change based on the contracted salary amount for the new people in those positions. We have no reason to believe that cost should exceed the current total salary for the two positions.

ATA Hiring Committee

In order to find the best possible candidate for ATA, the Board will want to consider establishing a hiring committee. The Board has discretion as to how many individuals make up the committee and who is represented. Typically a hiring committee will have no more than seven members in total.

We recommend that the group should consist of the incumbent ATA, the Selectboard's Executive Secretary, two department heads, one representative from the Selectboard, One representative from the CIC, and one at-large member from the community.

WR's Transition Strategy to from ATA to TA

In the immediate term, Walter will start to take lead on emerging tasks that will extend beyond Steve's tenure. For example, the Cable Re-licensing Process which will start of the next 3-6 months, but is a 24 month endeavor. Updating the Erving Sewer Agreement is another example. Steve will provide WR guidance and orientation at the outset.

Walter is engaging closely in the FY25 budget cycle so that he will have a strong basis of policies and practices for the FY26 cycle. Walter engaged closely with Steve on the development of the FY25 Selectboard budget. Walter will take an active role in supporting the development of the FY Town Meeting Warrant

The ATA job description will be updated and approved by the Selectboard by late January/Early February. We anticipate it will generally remain similar in scope. The focus of the position is in support of effective capital planning and grant and project management for complex, interdisciplinary projects in addition to general assignment of tasks by the TA and SB.

The Massachusetts School Building Authority (the "MSBA") would like to thank the Gill-Montague Regional School District (the "District") for expressing an interest in the MSBA's grant program for school building construction, renovation, and repair projects through the 2023 Statement of Interest (the "SOI") process.

Overall, the MSBA received 63 SOIs from 52 different school districts for consideration in 2023. In reviewing SOIs, the MSBA identifies the school facilities that have the greatest and most urgent need based on an assessment of the entire cohort of SOIs that are received for consideration each year.

Based upon the MSBA's review and due diligence process, it has been determined that the Sheffield Elementary School SOI will not be invited into the MSBA's Eligibility Period this year. If the District would like this school to be considered for future collaboration with the MSBA, the District should file an SOI in an upcoming year. The MSBA will begin accepting SOIs for consideration in 2024 on Friday, January 12, 2024. Please see the information below regarding the upcoming 2024 SOI process, which is also stated on the MSBA's website.

If the District is planning to submit an SOI in 2024, consider notifying local governing boards of your intentions, as local governing bodies will have to vote to approve submission of an SOI with the vote(s) uploaded to the SOI system.

- The SOI closing date for districts submitting under the Accelerated Repair Program, which is primarily for the partial or full replacement of windows/doors and/or roofs in an otherwise structurally sound facility, will be Friday, March 1, 2024.
- The SOI closing date for districts submitting under the Core Program, which is primarily for projects considered as extensive repairs, renovations, addition/renovations, and new school construction will be Friday, April 12, 2024.

The MSBA remains committed to collaborating and partnering with the Gill-Montague Regional School District to better understand school facility issues. The MSBA will be sending detailed information regarding the 2024 SOI process in the coming weeks.
