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School District Regionalization Planning Committee

Consider whether to establish a planning committee to explore further regionalization of the GMRSD to include member towns of the Pioneer Valley Regional School District

Kuklewicz: This is to consider the formation of a planning committee. There is no commitment to regionalize with the towns in the Pioneer regional district (inc., Leyden, Bernardston, Northfield, and Warwick).

- Populations are trending downward, costs are rising, and so the districts have all have to pare back on some of the services that they offer.
- This is a way to look at what it might mean if we were to try to establish a 6- or 7-town district.
- The State has set up a system in which the regional planning committee can be established by (1) going to the Board of Selectmen or (2) going to the School Committee.
- The Town Moderator appoints three numbers, one of which must be a School Committee representative.
- A power point presentation shows advantages for cost savings or improvement of programs.
- This would increase the pool of students so that programs that may not have been cut but are struggling would potentially have complete classrooms.
- There is a formula that allows the group to get grant money from the State.
- We are looking at fall or beginning of next year before the group gets going.
- We need to look long term at the district.
- The Gill Selectboard voted in the affirmative in creating a planning committee.
- Ellis feels that the civic leaders believe it would be irresponsible not to explore an option that might potentially lead to some modest cost savings and enhancements to the education that we can provide the students throughout the region.
- There is no commitment to extra regionalization, but there is a commitment to study whether it is in the best interest of our community and our children.
