David Detmold and other Precinct 5 Town Meeting Members Request Discussion on compromise redesign plan for the renovations of Spinner Park

- Ramsey gives some background information on the compromise redesign plan.
- Edite Cunha shares her disappointments; the public didn't get a chance to meet with the relevant people until September; the meeting was discouraging in that the public was told it was too late to make any changes; she feels that the changes that are being made to the park are deeply invasive and interfere with the intimacy of the park; the public feels disappointed in this process and urges the Selectboard to look at it again.
- Jean Hebden feels that leaflets should have been passed out as a lot of people don't have internet. She also expresses that elderly and poor people use that park, and if it's opened up it wouldn't be the same. Ninety people have signed a petition who don't feel the design is a good design.
- John Hanold states that the compromise does not discourage the original proposal, but has the advantage of keeping the park intimate.
- Nelson asks if it's possible to add extra benches in the middle so that people can have conversations with each other.
- Suzanne LoManto responds that there have been discussions about bringing in pieces of movable furniture, corner benches, and large planters. In addition, she feels that moving the sculpture forward does not show the best angles as the sculpture should be seen primarily from the front.
- Ariel Elan expresses that she is moved by the thoughtfulness of the alternative proposal. She feels that the process should not be considered a failure. Lastly, she feels that when people who experience limitations find something that is very important to them, that needs to be elevated to a very high level of respect and response.
- Brian McHugh clarifies that this project was funded for Town-wide benefit, not just a particular area. Also, the grant was not awarded until September, and the conversations started happening after that. He expresses concern about the area behind the statue where a bench will be placed. Lastly, he feels that if this design goes through, we need to give the other people in town the opportunity to comment on it.
- Ellis feels that the idea was presented to as broad a spectrum of people as possible without any bias. Several hundred people thought that the statue should be in the back of the park. He worries that any time a grant-based project is changed, there is an introduction of new risk and uncertainty. He was not comfortable undoing the public process and could not recommend to the Selectboard to reinitiate that process at this point.
- Boutwell does not know why some of these issues were not brought up a while ago.
- Kuklewicz feels that the design was thoughtful, that many people were invested in the process, and now there is a group of people who don't like it. He thinks that the statue placement is a red herring and feels that where it is going to be placed shows prominence to the statue.

• The Selectboard supports the design as it currently is.
