AGREEMENT FOR SERVICES

MONTAGUE FLU CLINICS

This agreement dated July 1, 2020 is by and between the Franklin Regional Council of Governments, doing business at 12 Olive St., Suite 2, Greenfield, MA 01301 hereby referred to as FRCOG, and the Montague Board of Health, hereby referred to as Service Provider.

Responsibility of SERVICE PROVIDER: Service Provider shall provide the services or procure the goods as approved by the Massachusetts Department of Public Health in Attachment A: FY21 BIDLS Immunization Funding Workplan.

The Service Provider shall follow all regulations of MGL Ch30(b) for purchase of supplies and services with the funding provided.

The Service Provider is expected to carry suitable levels of professional and personal/auto insurance for the type of services rendered as well as statutorily required Workers Compensation insurance.

Schedule: The term of this agreement is effective from July 1, 2020 to December 31, 2020.

Responsibility of FRCOG: The FRCOG shall make available to the Service Provider information pertinent to the project. The FRCOG will reimburse the Service Provider for expenses as approved in Attachment B: Approved BIDLS Budget.

Payments to the Service Provider: Service Provider will be paid \$1,506.49. Invoices should document dates of services and a description of services rendered. FRCOG expects the Service Provider will provide his or her own professional supplies and materials. The FRCOG is not subject to sales tax. A Federal W-9 Form must be submitted with the signed contract. The form may be found at http://www.irs.gov/pub/irs-pdf/fw9.pdf. Payments may be delayed if the W-9 form is not submitted.

Invoices for work at the end of the fiscal year must be received by FRCOG by January 15, 2021. Due to certain funding constraints, if an invoice is not received by this deadline, payment could be jeopardized.

Indemnity: The Service Provider shall indemnify and hold the FRCOG, its officials, agents, servants and employees harmless from and against any and all liability including suits, actions, legal proceedings, claims, demands, costs, expenses, and attorney fees for damage to persons or property of any kind whatsoever arising out of any and all activities to be conducted by the Service Provider pursuant to this Agreement.

Confidentiality: The Service Provider will protect the privacy of, and respect the confidentiality of information provided by program participants, consistent with applicable federal and state regulations including M.G.L. C.66, Section 10, regarding access to public records.

Nondiscrimination: The Contractor shall not discriminate against any person because of race, gender, age, color, religion, ancestry, handicap, sexual orientation, sexual identity, gender identity, veteran status, national origin or any other protected class under the law.

Force Majeure: The Service Provider shall not be liable for the failure to wholly perform his duties if such failure is caused by catastrophe, riot, war, governmental order or regulation, strike, fire, accident, act of God or other similar or different contingency beyond the reasonable control of the Service Provider.

Amendments: This agreement may be amended provided such amendment is mutually agreeable and committed to in writing by the signatories hereto.

Termination: The Council may terminate this Agreement for non-performance of the services required under this Agreement including the progress of work for such services. Upon receipt of written notification from the Council to the Service Provider that the Agreement or any portion thereof is to be terminated, the Service Provider shall immediately cease operations on the work stipulated, and assemble all material that has been prepared, developed, furnished or obtained under the terms of the Agreement that may be in the possession or custody of the Service Provider and shall transmit the same to the Council on or before the fifteenth (15th) day following the receipt of the written notice of termination together with his/her evaluation of the cost of the work performed. The Service Provider shall be entitled to complete payment for any satisfactorily completed uncompensated work performed prior to such notice and for the cost of assembling the material to be transmitted to the Council.

Vote/Resolution Authorizing the Town of Montague to Participate in the Massachusetts Commercial Property Assessed Clean Energy Program (PACE Massachusetts)

WHEREAS, pursuant to M.G.L. c. 23M, as amended (the "PACE Act"), the Commonwealth has established a commercial sustainable energy program known as the Massachusetts Property Assessed Clean Energy Program ("PACE Massachusetts") to provide a financing mechanism ("PACE financing") to private owners of commercial and industrial properties for certain qualifying commercial energy improvements ("improvements"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the PACE Act, PACE Massachusetts is administered by the Massachusetts Development Finance Agency ("MassDevelopment"), in consultation with the Massachusetts Department of Energy Resources; and

WHEREAS, under PACE Massachusetts, the owner of the commercial or industrial property benefitting from the improvements (the "benefitted property") is required to repay the PACE financing through the payment of a betterment assessment (a "PACE betterment assessment") placed on such benefitted property by the municipality in which the benefitted property is located; and

WHEREAS, in order for an owner of commercial or industrial property to participate in PACE Massachusetts, Section 2 of the PACE Act requires that the municipality in which such property is located must elect to participate in PACE Massachusetts; and

WHEREAS, the Town of Montague (the "Municipality") has determined that it is in the best interest of the Municipality to participate in PACE Massachusetts as a "participating municipality," as provided in the PACE Act, to permit the owners of commercial and industrial properties located in the Municipality to access PACE financing for qualifying commercial energy improvements through PACE Massachusetts; and

WHEREAS, the Town strongly prefers that renewable energy systems and energy efficiency projects are used before natural gas is considered, and recognizes that PACE Massachusetts moves us toward a reduction of greenhouse gas emissions;

WHEREAS, NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, as follows:

The Montague Selectboard hereby approves the Municipality's participation in PACE Massachusetts pursuant to the PACE Act, and authorizes the Selectboard Chair to enter into a PACE Massachusetts Municipal Assessment and Assignment Agreement (the "Agreement") with MassDevelopment, pursuant to which the Municipality will agree to:

(i) levy PACE betterment assessments and impose PACE betterment assessment liens on benefitted properties located in the Municipality, in the amounts determined by MassDevelopment to be sufficient to repay the PACE financing,

- (ii) assign the PACE betterment assessment liens to MassDevelopment, which MassDevelopment may in turn assign to the providers of the PACE financing (each a "capital provider"), as collateral for such PACE financing,
- (iii) include on the property tax bills for the benefitted properties the installment payments necessary to repay the PACE betterment assessments, in the amounts and at the times as determined by MassDevelopment,
- (iv) collect and pay over to MassDevelopment or its designee, the PACE betterment assessment installment payments, as and when collected, and
- (v) enforce, to the extent required by the Agreement, the PACE betterment assessments and liens; the Agreement to be substantially in the form presented to this meeting, with such changes, modifications and insertions as the Town Administrator may approve as being in the best interest of the Municipality. The Collector Treasurer of the Town or such other Town agency as may be designated in the Agreement is authorized to levy such PACE betterment assessments and impose the PACE betterment assessment liens on behalf of the Town without further authorization by this legislative body.

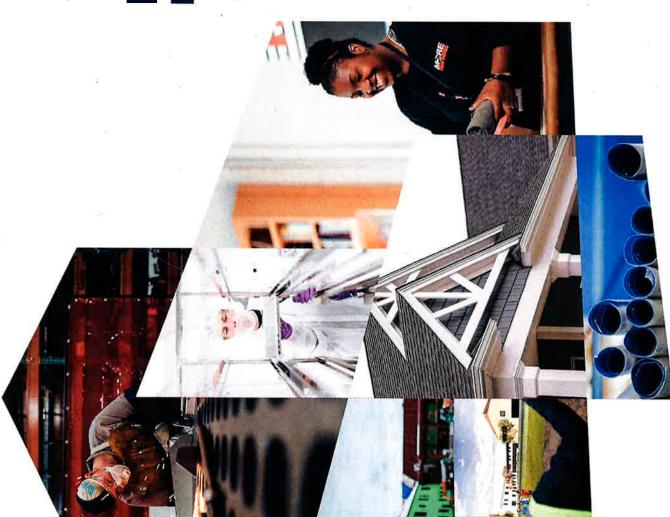

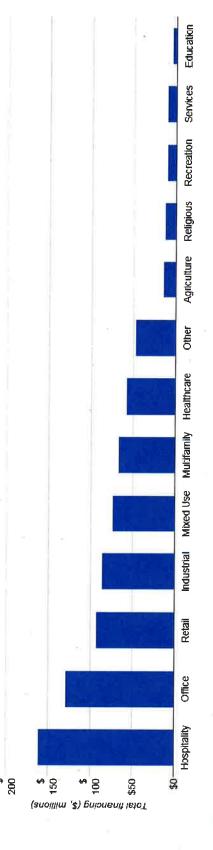

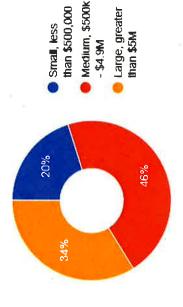

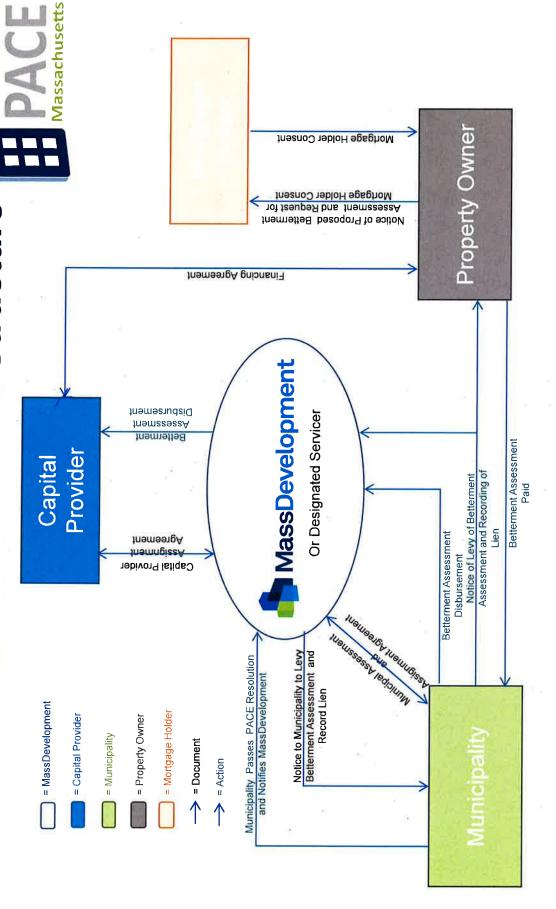

Please find below a summary of the fees necessary to complete the plan modifications needed to maintain the unforeseen electric service found running under Spinner Park during construction. Eversource allowed for the electric lines to stay in place after the town requested a reconsideration of the previous decision to re-route the service and move the park service. To allow the lines to remain Eversource has requested to:

- 1. Add a new open bottom pull box at the edge of the park to allow access to the existing service.
- 2. Scope the spare empty conduit to make sure it was in good shape.
- Leave enough space between the planting bed of the park and the adjoining sidewalk to allow for a future re-route of the service if needed.

To fulfill Eversource request Berkshire Design Group will need to adjust the Site Utilities Plan, Site Layout Plan, Seat Wall Detail where it crosses the electric service, modify electric meter box, and water valve box locations. Berkshire Design will need to survey the existing conduit location to add the information to the site plan to determine changes required. Berkshire design also will subcontract a plumbing company to scope and clean the spare conduit. The additional work will require an additional fee of \$3,000, to the original contract for the Spinner Park Renovation Project.
